

DIRECT PAYMENTS AND CARERS

From November 2007 there will be some new funding for carer direct payments for carers of all adults. Carer Direct Payments may only be provided for the direct use/benefit of the carer. This new money held can therefore not be used for Residential or Nursing or home care services. It can be used for anything that is for carers themselves - (including young carers looking after adults) eg:

- ◆ family holidays
- ◆ funding for fees for vocational training / life long learning
- ◆ costs of leisure activities eg membership of a health club or golf course
- ◆ equipment that will help the carer eg a lap top that helps a carer study
- ◆ help for young carers to do their homework
- ◆ anything which from the carers point of view gives "something for me"
